New Woman, New Vision Women Photographers of the Bauhaus Museum für Fotografie 17.04.2026 to 04.10.2026

Discover the fascinating world of Bauhaus female photographers! The exhibition shows how innovative artists experimented with cameras and composition, thereby shaping modern photography. From portraits and architectural photographs to bold abstractions—experience how the “new woman” of the 1920s developed a new view of the world.

Ruin and Rush. Berlin 1910–1930 Neue Nationalgalerie 25.04.2026 to 03.01.2027

The exhibition “Ruin and Rush” focuses on selected works from the collection of Classical Modernism that address the Berlin of the 1910s and 1920s. These decades – marked by the First World War and the Weimar Republic – constantly oscillated between opposites: Excess and poverty, emancipation and extremism went hand in hand in the rapidly growing, cosmopolitan metropolis. It brings to life the ambivalence of glamour and misery, rise and fall in Berlin between 1910 and 1930.



Lina Lapelytė – Werkgespräch Hamburger Bahnhof – Nationalgalerie der Gegenwart 01.05.2026 to 10.01.2027

The artist talk for the second edition of the CHANEL Commission focuses on Lina Lapelytė’s participatory work, which transforms the Historic Hall of the Hamburger Bahnhof into a multi-voiced stage. 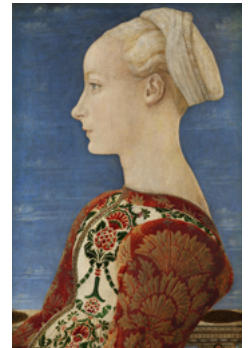


Cassirer and the Breakthrough of Impressionism Alte Nationalgalerie 22.05.2026 bis 27.09.2026

Genghis Khan and the world of the Mongols James-Simon-Galerie 21.10.2026 to 18.04.2027

In less than a century, the Mongol ruler Genghis Khan and his successors conquered the largest land empire in history by 1292. Through laws, trade routes and postal stations, they created an order that began an intensive exchange of goods and ideas between Asia and Europe. The exhibition showcases fascinating archaeological finds that tell of the early globalization under the Mongol Khans and of the origins of their culture.

World of Colours. 100 years Verner Panton Kunstgewerbemuseum 13.11.2026 to 23.05.2027

“Colors are life. Panton lived them.” – Join us in celebrating the 100th birthday of Danish designer and architect Verner Panton (1926–1998). His visionary designs shaped the 1960s and represent a radical departure into modernity. With over 100 exhibits, the exhibition shows how Panton revolutionized living – from iconic furniture to immersive living environments.
