Pergamonmuseum, Museumsinsel Berlin
From Spring 2027

The museum is open again! The innovative exhibition concept allows visitors to experience the carefully restored objects in a new way. The tour brings together works from 2,600 years of human history. It leads from the Pergamon Altar to the victory stele of the Assyrian king Esarhaddon and the façade of the Caliph’s Palace of Mshatta to the magnificently painted Aleppo Room from the 17th century. The shapes, colors, and symbols of these architectural works continue to have an impact today.

is BACK!

The Pergamonmuseum is back!

The major cultural event of 2027 will be the reopening of the Pergamonmuseum in spring. After years of extensive renovation, one of the world's most famous museums will once again open its doors to the public and the Pergamon Altar will be on display again.

The permanent exhibition at the Museum für Islamische Kunst has been completely revamped. The new exhibition makes the museum the largest and most innovative of its kind in the world. Spanning more than twice the previous area over two floors, it will showcase objects that have never been exhibited before, as well as spectacular international loans. Highlights include the Aleppo Room, the Alhambra Dome, prayer and living room niches, and the early Islamic Mshatta Facade.

2027 is also the third year of the five-year anniversary celebrations marking the 200th birthday of Berlin's Museumsinsel and marks a milestone: all five buildings on Museumsinsel will be open to the public again. Visitors will experience Museumsinsel in a completely new way, as the entrance to the Pergamonmuseum leads through the idyllic, Arcadian colonnades on the banks of the Spree – undoubtedly one of the most atmospheric places in the capital.

The Pergamonmuseum was the last historical museum to be built on Museumsinsel, designed by Alfred Messel and constructed by Ludwig Hoffmann between 1910 and 1930. The three-winged complex has become world-famous for its impressive reconstructions of archaeological building ensembles – the Pergamon Altar, the Market Gate of Miletus, the Ishtar Gate with the Processional Way of Babylon, and the Mshatta Facade. Since 2013, the building has been undergoing renovation in two phases. The completion of the final phase of renovation is planned for 2037.
