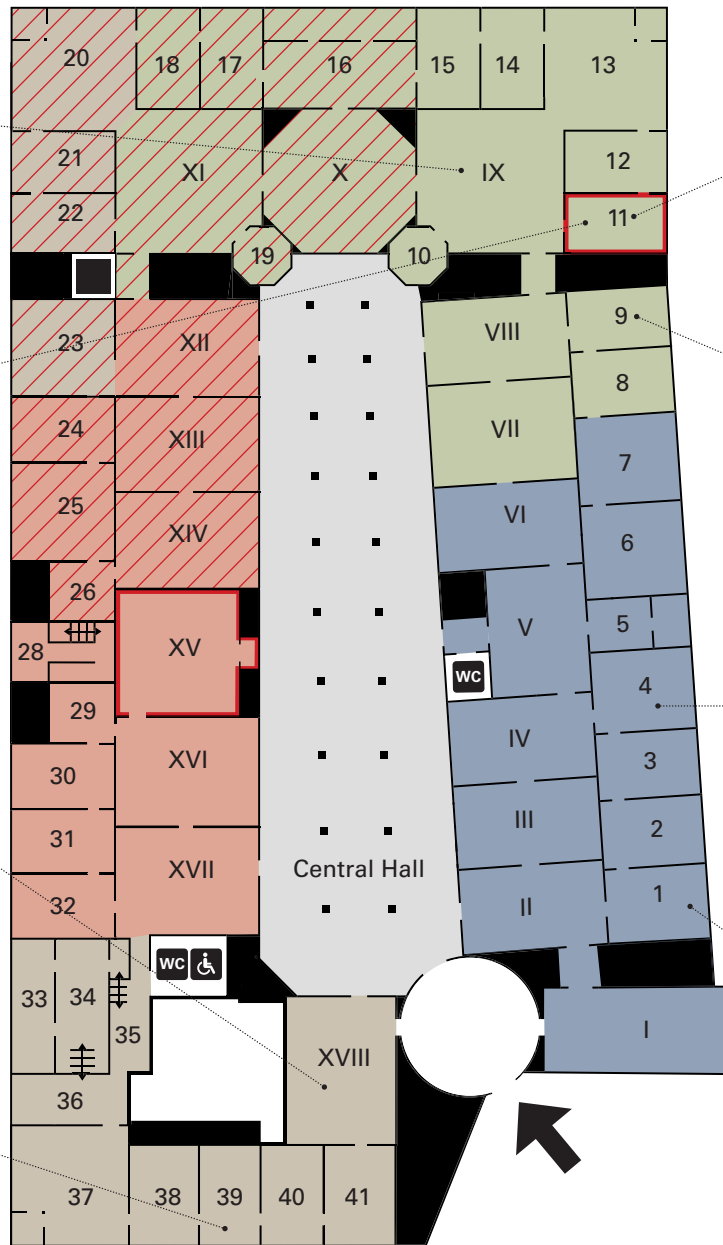

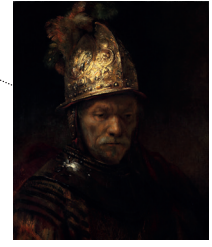

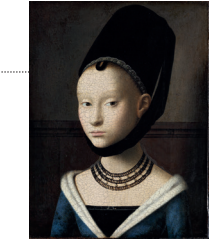

WELCOME TO THE GEMÄLDEGALERIE

The Gemäldegalerie (Old Master Paintings) of the Staatliche Museen zu Berlin (National Museums in Berlin) holds one of the most important collections of European art, ranging from the beginning of medieval panel painting in the 13th century through to the Neoclassicism of the period around 1800. This collection makes it possible to study the history of European painting in all its schools and epochs.

Since its opening in 1830 the collection has had an eventful history. Today, some 1,300 paintings are exhibited in the gallery at the Kulturforum. The focus of the collection lies on Italian art of the 13th to 17th centuries, with works by the great Italians Giotto, Botticelli, Raphael, Titian and Caravaggio, as well as the early German masters, with paintings by Konrad Witz, Albrecht Dürer, Lucas Cranach and Hans Holbein.

One of the highlights is the world's most important collection of Netherlandish art from the 15th and 16th centuries. It includes masterpieces by Jan van Eyck, Rogier van der Weyden, Hugo van der Goes and Pieter Bruegel. The holdings of the Dutch and Flemish masters of the 17th century are also outstanding. In addition to one of the largest Rembrandt collections in the world, the Gemäldegalerie holds masterpieces by Vermeer, Rubens, Anton van Dyck, Frans Hals and Jan van Goyen.

The splendid collection of Italian, French, German and English paintings of the 18th century includes works by Canaletto, Jean-Antoine Watteau, Antoine Pesne and Thomas Gainsborough.
