To mark the exhibition, on April 17 a shop window at KaDeWe will show Belling's mannequin sculptures and high end products from the department store's current offerings. Already in the 1920s, KaDeWe used Belling's pioneering mannequins for their window decorations.

Collaboration with Technische Universität Berlin

Together with the modeling and design program at Technische Universität (TU) Berlin's Institut für Architektur (institute for architecture), several works by Rudolf Belling were reconstructed especially for the exhibition. In the framework of a project seminar, students under the direction of Burkhard Lüdtke, Annette Müller, and Robert Niemann engaged with Belling's work and created models of lost sculpture and architecture.
